## **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**

**Matthew J. Olson** is Director of Choral Activities at Carleton College, Artistic Director of Bach Roots Festival, and Assistant Conductor of The Singers – MN Choral Artists. Bach Roots Festival's recent performances have been hailed as "masterful" (*B Minor Mass*) and "a gripping realization" (*St. John Passion*) by The Star Tribune. In 2019, he served as chorusmaster for The St. Paul Chamber Orchestra's production of Bach's *St. John Passion* with The Singers for which the choir was praised for being "scrupulously prepared" in a performance that was "one of the most satisfying you could ever hope to hear" (*Star Tribune*).

A passionate music educator, Matthew was named Minnesota's 2024 Collegiate Music Educator of the Year. He has served as visiting professor at St. Olaf College and a visiting conductor at Florida State University. His award-winning choral arrangements and compositions are published by Colla Voce, Santa Barbara, and via his website. Matthew studied choral and orchestral conducting at St. Olaf College, The Oregon Bach Festival, Michigan State University, The Canford Conducting School (U.K.), and The University of Minnesota. He lives in Northfield with his wife Maureen and their children Ani and Holden.

**Nathan Proctor**, *piano*, holds degrees in church music and organ performance from St. Olaf College and Indiana University, having studied with John Ferguson and Larry Smith. He has served congregations in Minnesota, California, and North Carolina, and is currently Organist and Director of Worship, Music, and Arts at St. John's Lutheran Church in Northfield, MN.

In addition to overseeing a large music program, each week he leads worship at the organ and directs choirs of youth and adults. He is also an active clinician and hymn festival leader.

Andrew Kane, baritone, is a Minnesota native and has been performing sacred, oratorio and consort repertoire locally, nationally and internationally since 2007. Recent appearances include Elijah with the Saint Mark's Cathedral music series, Britten's Cantata Misericordium with the Oratorio Society, and Monteverdi's 1610 Vespers with Consortium Carissimi. He has enjoyed regular appearances as a soloist for a number of Twin Cities sacred music series, including those of Saint Mark's, Holy Family Catholic Church, Mount Olive Lutheran, and House of Hope Presbyterian, with whom he performed the role of the Bishop in Stephen Paulus's opera The Three Hermits in 2017. Andrew also has solo and consort credits with many other ensembles, including The Mirandola Ensemble, The Rose Ensemble, Minnesota Bach Ensemble, Lyra Baroque Orchestra, the Minnesota Bach Society, and the Oregon Bach Festival, and enjoys regular appearances with Transept of Sioux Falls. He holds a degree in voice from Augsburg College.

KrisAnne Weiss (she/her), *mezzo-soprano*, performs an eclectic array of music-theater and concert works, appearing with Skylark Opera Theatre, Lyric Opera of the North, Nautilus Music-Theater, Opera on the Lake, and Mixed Precipitation's Pickup Truck Opera, among many others. Most recently, she played the role of Ruth in *Dark Sisters* with Journey North Opera, and multiple roles in An Opera Theatre's production of Marc Blitzstein's *The Cradle Will Rock*. She hosts and facilitates An Opera Theatre's Voice Lab, a free monthly artistic development and community-building resource for Twin Cities singers at any point in their careers, and she is on the voice faculty at St. Olaf College.
