All presentations must be submitted on Monday, and presentations will be delivered in class on Wednesday and Friday. This is a 20 minute presentation.

Presentation should follow this general order:

1. Overview of topic.

What question were you asking related to power? What was your thesis? How does this connect to topics we discussed in class? I would strongly recommend choosing a topic that connects both to the overall concept of power (power bases, power and influence definitions, etc.) as well as one or more specific topics.

2. Overview of academic sources

You should provide a quick summary of the academic sources that you reviewed. In this section you are describing each source, and then providing a lay-person overview. Remember, all sources should be academic sources, prioritizing primary sources, with at least 2 being research-based. You should shoot to have 10+ sources.

3. 3-4 Conclusions, drawn from multiple sources

After reviewing all of your sources, you should draw 3-4 conclusions, and seek to prove your thesis. A conclusion cannot be drawn without at least two sources supporting this.

Presentations will be graded on the following criteria (40 Points)

- 10 Points- Professionalism. Is the PowerPoint fully professional and error free? Do presentations stay within the time frame? Are presentations given in a way that shows preparation?
- 10 Points- Research. Did the students conduct academic research? Is it clear that they reviewed both primary and secondary sources? Is it clear that they utilized at least 2 primary research sources. Is the research cross functional and unbiased?
- 20 Points- Analysis and topic. Does the topic selected directly relate to power, and is this connection clearly explained? Are the students able to explain their thesis, and clearly prove it using multiple academic sources? Does the analysis conducted add additional meaning to the topic, and take facts to application?
