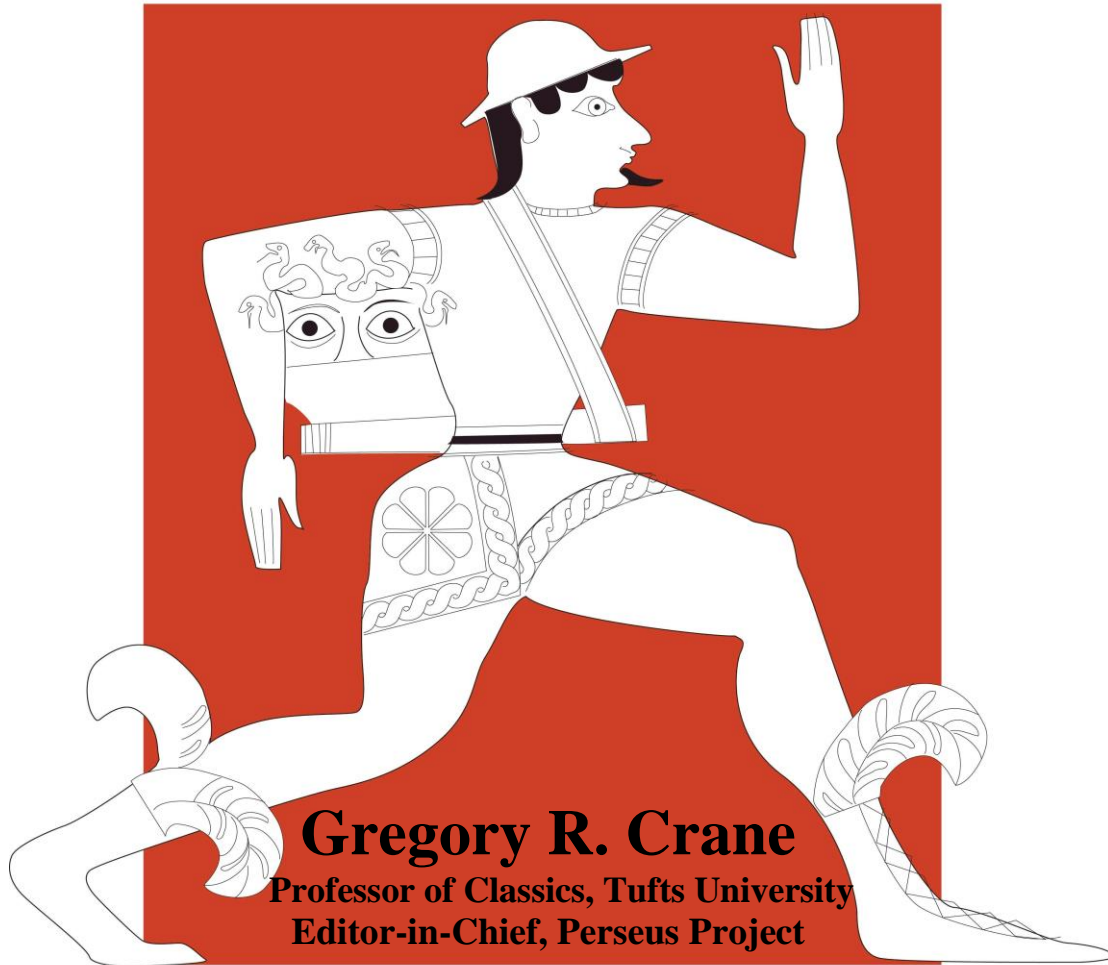


The James M. May Endowed Lecture in Classics

Philology and the Future of Work

Dr. Crane's interests are twofold. Not only has he published on a wide range of ancient Greek authors, with a special focus on Thucydides, but his work has been instrumental in connecting the humanities with evolving digital technology. His contributions include developing a Unix-based text retrieval system in the 1980's, directing a Digital Library Initiative program from 1998 through 2006 to study problems of digital libraries in the humanities, and, more recently, developing a database morphological analysis system while directing the Perseus Project as Editor-in-Chief. He is currently interested in helping the emerging Cyberinfrastructure serve the needs of the humanities and classical studies, in particular.
