



St. Olaf Theater Camp - No Surprises!

Our goal is to make St. Olaf Summer Theater Camp wonderful for everyone and eliminating some surprises will make your camp experience more fun. If you are coming to Theater Camp the following information is for you. So, read on, save this information, and don't forget to read it again before you leave for camp.

Arrival

Check-in is between 2:00 pm and 3:00 pm. Campus signs will direct you to the residence hall. Camp counselors will be wearing easily identifiable camp t-shirts and will be there to answer any questions.

Campus Policies

Please read through the campus policies. These rules are to help ensure the safety and comfort of all guests on campus. Breaking rules could mean an early trip home.

Cars

Campers who drive to campus will need a temporary permit to park on campus during your camp stay. Campers are not allowed to leave the campus during camp without **written** permission from a parent.

Clothes

This is camp – so casual wear is IN. Weather can range from cool to hot, sunny to soaking. Check the forecast (www.weather.com) and pack accordingly. **You must bring at least one pair of tennis shoes, closed-toed shoes must be worn in the theater building and during all class sessions.**

Internet

Public computers are available so you can keep in touch with friends and family, though free time is limited. No need to bring your own computer (see section on valuables below).

Medications

Please let us know if you are taking prescription medications. If you like, medications can be kept with your counselor. Refrigeration is available.

Money

You will not *need* to buy anything at camp. However, most campers like to bring spending money to buy snacks, pizzas, a college t-shirt, etc. The college bookstore will be open Monday through Friday.

Phone Calls and Letters

All the information you need to know is in the Camp Policy and Contact Information.

Roommates

You will be housed with your preferred roommate only if you both have requested each other. If you have not requested a specific roommate, one will be assigned to you.

Stuff to bring

We'll provide a pillow, blanket, sheets, pillowcase, towel, and washcloth. You may wish to bring: your own pillow - a reading lamp - a small fan - an alarm clock – your teddy bear...

There will be a camper showcase so if you have a musical instrument, batons, or other props you wish to incorporate into a performance please feel free to bring it.

Transportation

Campers needing shuttle service to and from campus please email summer@stolaf.edu for local transportation options.

Valuables

Please do not bring valuables to camp! A good rule of thumb is: don't bring anything you can't bear to have broken or lost. If you *really* care about it – leave it at home.

Lost Key

Each camper will be given a room key. A \$100 fee will be assessed to any camper not returning their room key during check out.

Visitors

Visitors to camp, should check in at the Camps, Conferences, and Events Office in Buntrock Commons, Room 146 – visitors will not be admitted to the residence hall. Please notify your son or daughter as well as the Camps Office (phone number below) in advance if you plan a visit.
