#### AREA OF EMPHASIS

The purpose of the area of emphasis (AOE) is to provide a structured program of study beyond the major to give motivated students the opportunity for in-depth work in a particular economic field. Students pursuing an area of emphasis in law and public policy develop the critical insights necessary to understand how legal systems operate and how government initiatives work, or don't work, to accomplish social goals such as environmental protection, economic development, poverty reduction, health care access, public education, and care for the elderly and the disabled. Completion of the law and public policy area of emphasis not only promotes a lifetime of informed civic engagement and active citizenship, but it also prepares students for careers in the public sector, as well as for admission to graduate programs in law, public policy, and economics. Contracts for an AOE must be individually negotiated with the program director during the junior year of college.

## Requirements for an Area of Emphasis in Law and Public Policy

To be awarded an area of emphasis in law and public policy, students must (1) complete the major in economics and (2) successfully complete four additional courses, chosen from the list below. A grade of C or above is required for all courses in the area of emphasis.

All students pursuing an area of emphasis in law and public policy must take Econ 240: Introduction to Law and Economics, and two economic analysis course with an applied law or policy component at the 200-level or 300-level in economics, and a law or policy focused course outside of the economics department.
