Note the Following:

- In order to fulfill the requirements for the English major, you must take a minimum of 10 courses. This means that in the table above you should have a different course on each line.
- Of the courses that you take at the 200-level (literary history, cross-cultural, cross-disciplinary, genre, or elective) at least one must focus on a period prior to 1800 **AND** at least one must focus on a period after 1800.
- For your 300-level electives, you may count only **ONE** of ENGL 371, ENGL 372, OR ENGL 373. If you take more than one of these courses, they can be used in slots 7-10 above.
- Neither ENGL 396 (Directed Undergraduate Research) nor ENGL 398 (Independent Research) can be used to fulfill your 300-level elective requirement. These can be used in slots 7-10 above.
- Students who complete the full, five-semester Great Conversation sequence will receive credit for one elective (slots 7-10).
- Students who complete ID 258: Theater in London receive credit for one elective (slots 7-10).
- Any course taken in the English Department at the 100-, 200-, or 300-level can count toward one of your four electives (slots 7-10 above).
- Students who anticipate using transfer credit (such as credit earned during study abroad) to fulfill major requirements should consult the English Department chair. There are limits on the use of transfer credit for this purpose.
