681 seniors have declared 905 majors and 299 concentrations.

468 (68.7%) seniors have declared **one major**, 202 (29.7%) have declared **two majors**, and 11 (1.6%) have declared **three majors**.

206 (30.2%) have declared **one concentration**, 42 (6.2%) have declared **two concentrations**, and 3 (0.4%) have declared **three concentrations**.

The GPA for the Class of 2016 was 3.39; the GPA for the Class of 2015 was 3.41.

As of today, 263 seniors out of 681 will graduate with honors (38.6%).

Off-Campus Study*

Of the 681 seniors, 500 or 73.4% participated in at least one **off-campus Domestic or International program** (Year, Semester, Interim, or Summer). 186 (27.3%) participated in two or more programs.

Domestic off-campus programs – 98 students, 14.4% participation

International off-campus programs – 459 students, 67.4% participation
