711 seniors have declared 955 majors and 329 concentrations.

480 (67.5%) seniors have declared **one major**, 218 (30.7%) have declared **two majors**, and 13 (1.8%) have declared **three majors**.

231 (32.5%) have declared **one concentration**, 43 (6.0%) have declared **two concentrations**, and 4 (0.6%) have declared **three concentrations**.

Of the 711 seniors, 504 or 70.9% participated in at least one **off-campus Domestic or International program** (Year, Semester, Interim, or Summer). 207 (29.1%) participated in two or more programs.
