722 seniors have declared 979 majors and 332 concentrations.

475 (65.8%) seniors have declared **one major**, 237(32.8%) have declared **two majors**, and 10 (1.4%) have declared **three majors**.

220 (30.5%) have declared **one concentration**, 53 (7.3%) have declared **two concentrations**, and 2 (0.3%) have declared **three concentrations**.

Off-Campus Study*

Of the 722 seniors, 528 or 73.1% participated in at least one **off-campus Domestic or International program** (Year, Semester, Interim, or Summer). 212 (29.4%) participated in two or more programs.

Domestic off-campus programs – 94 students, 13.0% participation

International off-campus programs – 494 students, 68.4% participation
