The <u>Smith Center for Global Engagement</u> provides opportunities to expand the liberal arts education learning globally and to local communities within the U.S. Programs are offered during January Term, fall semester, spring semester, and during an academic year. There is an application process for each of these programs and courses. Semester and year programs tend to remain the same from year to year with some minor changes. January Term programs can differ based on faculty availability, budgets, and programming.

Smith Center programs can be viewed on the <u>application database</u>. Single searches and more advanced searches can be done to find a program within a student's <u>area of study and interest</u>.
