THE TASK: Respond to the areas below and on the next pages to prepare yourself for discussion. This reflection upon who we currently are is critical to discerning who we are called to be, what we are called to do, and why we are so that we can more intentionally engage in ministry on purpose for the common good.

Please respond to the following areas as they relate to the congregation's ministry now.

C. List the things our congregation is being asked to be **open** to at this time. Note how you personally respond to each invitation. (EX: Sharing leadership with a neighboring congregation – apprehensive; Connecting with the neighborhood food bank – positive; Repaving the parking lot – neutral; Adding a Wednesday night, intergenerational formation experience and eliminating Sunday School – open but grieving).
