# Career Day with the MNTwins

On Friday, March 10, 2023, The St. Olaf Upward Bound (UB) program collaborated with UB and Humboldt alumni Leticia Silva to organize Career Day at the MN Twins. Leti is the Senior Vice President of Human Resources for the MN Twins and has been with the organization for 25 years. UB had 65 sophomore and junior students join us for the exciting day!

The day started with a panel that included five Twins representatives from the administration, community relations, ballpark operations, and technology departments. Each panelist shared their role, career path, and personal story of finding their way to the Twins organization. They also shared career advice, encouragement and UB students were given the opportunity to ask the panelists questions.

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After the panel and Q&A session, students were treated to lunch provided by the MN Twins before going on a tour. Students were separated into groups and went with their tour guide to learn more about Target Field. During the tour, students visited the MN Twin's locker room, event suites, and broadcasting room. We also learned about the stadium's sustainability and environmental efforts, including their rainwater recycling system and waste-to-energy program. 

It is important to continue to do your best in all your classes to show colleges you are focused on your goals. In addition, you will have opportunities in 11th grade to apply for scholarships, National Honor Society (NHS), and other programs. Your grades this year will influence your ability to apply for these opportunities. Remember to keep building your resume, and focus on completing a strong year.

Now for 11<sup>th</sup> graders, when you apply to college next fall, your grades from this spring will be the most recent final grades that colleges will see. Don't give colleges a reason to doubt your commitment to your education by slacking off. Continue to challenge yourself by taking advanced classes, come to Upward Bound for help, and utilize all the resources you have! Also, remember that this summer will probably be one of your most important summers with UB. Your PSE year will be filled with college visits, resume building and writing your college essay. This summer it's extremely important that you attend UB, so we won't accept any excuses about missing this summer.

Last but certainly not least, Bridge students, if you have already been admitted to the college of your choice, congratulations, but don't celebrate just yet. Colleges will see your final transcript from high school and can refuse to admit you if you fail your classes last quarter. REMEMBER, YOU DO NOT HAVE YOUR DIPLOMA YET! What all of you do have is a letter of acceptance from an institution, a promise of admission to the class of 2027. However, this offer of admission is not the "Golden Ticket." All colleges reserve the right to revoke your offer of admission if you show that you are giving up on high school, not completing the required courses or are taking some time away from serious academics. To college officials, slacking your senior year is a sign of academic struggles to come. Studies have shown that students who begin to slack during their senior year often continue the trend once they enter college. Colleges don't recruit students who seem bound to drop out. Not only do you need to stay in all of your classes, you also need to pass them with strong marks or you may run the risk of entering your first semester of college on academic probation (which is way worse than UB's probation), or not entering at all.


