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# New Student Orientation

On Saturday, April 29th, Upward Bound (UB) welcomed 70 newly admitted students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) to the St. Olaf College campus for New Student Orientation. Once students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) arrived on campus, they had a light breakfast. The orientation started with a welcome and introductions, and an overview of the activities for the day. Then, students and parent(s)/guardian(s) formed teams with other families to participate in a large group energizer activity called "pickpocket." During the activity, members of each group emptied their pockets and kept track of the total number of items that they carried that matched the items on the "pickpocket" list which included credit cards, photos, rewards cards, gum, etc. Teams had a fabulous time as they interacted with each other.

After the energizer activity, families headed to different conference rooms based on their interpretation needs for the orientation meeting. The UB sessions were offered in English, Karen, Hmong, Somali, and Spanish. In each session, the UB staff covered TRIO history, background information on TRIO programs, St. Olaf Upward Bound's evidence of achievement data, program rules, and expectations, and the schedule for a typical day during the summer program. These sessions allowed our families and students to learn more about UB and get familiar with the expectations for their students during their time in the program.

UB organized an alumni panel where former UB students shared their experiences and how they benefited from participating in UB as they prepared for college. Next, everyone enjoyed a delicious buffet lunch at Stav Hall, the St. Olaf College cafeteria. After lunch, students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) transitioned into the campus tour led by an admissions tour guide. Students and families explored the residence halls, recreation facilities, academic buildings, and science lab so they could get acclimated to the campus and learn where students will be taking courses and living during the six-week summer residential program.

To wrap up the day, students and their parents/guardians completed evaluations and received raffle tickets for a chance to win awesome prizes like Upward Bound apparel, water bottles, mugs, and school supplies. Overall, we received a lot of positive feedback from both parent(s)/guardian(s) and students. UB would like to thank all of our interpreters, student workers, tour guides, and alumni for helping us make this event a success!

# Summer Planning is Well Underway!

UB staff have been working hard to plan a fun and memorable summer for all our students who will be arriving on the St Olaf campus later in June. We want to remind students of our program dates and announce things to look forward to as you plan your summer!

The summer program starts on Tuesday, June 20, 2023, for Bridge (seniors), SLC members, and new UB students. Returning UB juniors and sophomores will start the following day on Wednesday, June 21, 2023.

Over the 4th of July weekend, underclass students will go home on Thursday, June 29, for the long July 4th break. For UB seniors, Bridge Night is scheduled for Thursday, June 29, 2023, so Bridge students will stay for an evening of fun activities. UB Bridge students will return home the morning of June 30, 2023. Additionally, there will be changes to UB's typical bus pick up the week of the 4th of July - all UB students will be picked-up at 9:00 am on Wednesday, July 5, 2023.

This summer, UB is offering two Bridge courses, International Relations taught by Professor Lot and Science in World and Word taught by Professor Forstner. In International Relations, students will study the current state of international relations and examine the institutions involved in managing the affairs of states. In the Science in World and Word course, students will participate in seminars and writing workshops that emphasize audience awareness, research, and text/image relationships.

Bridge students will also complete a paid summer internship on either the St. Olaf campus or within the Northfield area, which will give them work experience in their field of interest. This year, internship locations include the Northfield Community Action Center, Cannon Pointe Chiropractic, Northfield Hospital and Clinic, the St. Olaf IT department, the St. Olaf Piper Center, and more!

UB has fun, daily, evening activities planned for this summer, including roller-skating, the movies, bowling, volunteering at Feed My Starving Children, and a plenty more. If you have any ideas, please let Nou know - of course, realistic ideas only!

# SLC Leadership Day

In April, Upward Bound (UB) Student Leadership Council (SLC) members visited the newly established Peter J. King Family Foundation Leadership Center. UB's SLC members spent the day going through a series of group-based leadership workshops and held meaningful discussions on becoming a leader.

SLC members first completed a Leadership Style Self-Assessment where they answered various questions regarding their skill sets, areas of improvement, and communication styles. Each SLC member fell into the leadership styles of Driver (commanding style), Pioneer (promoting style), Explorer (analyzing style), or Navigator (supporting style). Through this self-assessment our SLC President, Peter, learned that he has a Pioneer leadership style - meaning, he is enthusiastic, people-oriented, and provides new concepts in group settings.

Bridge SLC member, Orathai, said her favorite activity of the day was The Leadership Portal. This activity was an immersive 360-degree video experience that placed SLC members in the heart of leadership scenarios, allowing them to apply skills learned during the day. It was the perfect opportunity to reflect on what influences the decisions they make, how to collaborate with teammates, and how to effectively implement their strengths.

SLC members concluded the day by designing a Leadership Action Plan, detailing how they envision themselves five years from now and how they intend on leading. UB staff hope that SLC members enjoyed their time together and continue to advance their leadership potential.



### 1) Is my attendance at the summer program mandatory? Why?

Yes. When you were first admitted to the Upward Bound program, you were informed of the four-year academic and summer program commitments. You and your parent(s)/guardian(s) signed the Student Responsibilities Contract agreeing to participate fully in all Upward Bound activities.

### 2) Why is the summer program so important?

The UB Summer Program allows you to experience "college life" and will prepare you for classes next year. You will take math, science and English classes and a variety of elective classes such as Art and Spanish. There are many social and cultural evening activities students will participate in, all provided for free. Being part of the UB summer program at St. Olaf College, students will have the opportunity to experience what college life is all about and picture themselves on a college campus.

### 3) What if I want to work?

If you already have a job or want to work during the summer, you can do so on the weekends and after July 26<sup>th</sup> until school begins again. Ideally, we urge students not to have a job over the summer. You are still pretty young, you have approximately 50 years of work ahead of you. A temporary summer job won't help you prepare for college, but a summer with Upward Bound will.

### 4) What if I have a family vacation or other commitments during the summer program? What's up with the fourth of July?

We urge families to take vacation in the later part of the summer so students won't miss the UB summer program. If any other conflicts arise, parent(s) or guardian(s) need to contact the director, Mari Avaloz.

The week of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July will be a little different; all UB students will have classes until Thursday afternoon before leaving for the extended July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend. Bridge students will stay back for Bridge night before leaving on Friday for their July 4th weekend. All students will return to campus on Wednesday, July 5th.

### 5) How is the Bridge summer different from the other three years?

Bridge students (students who have just graduated from high school) will take a college class this summer. The credits earned by taking the courses taught by St. Olaf College professor Anthony Lott (Political Science) and Dan Forstner (Education) will transfer to any college they attend. Along with their college course, Bridge students will take additional courses to support their learning and will complete a summer job-shadowing experience.

### 6) What is the PSE class?

Students who have just completed their 11<sup>th</sup> grade year will participate in the Post-Secondary Exploration class (PSE) this summer. Students will visit multiple public and private colleges across Minnesota and decide on the factors they feel are important when choosing a college.

Over the six-week period, students will write an essay to use for their college applications and create their own resume. By the end of the summer, students will have narrowed their college search and decided where they would like to apply. By the fall, as their friends are scrambling to complete college applications, UB students will be searching for scholarships and putting the finishing touches on their application.

### 7) Can I bring my large sneakers or my pet fish? Can I bring food?

You can bring whatever you want in your dorm room (except for animals, illegal substances, and anything else listed as...), but you take responsibility for your belongings. Security at St. Olaf and the Upward Bound program is good, but sometimes items disappear (usually when someone borrows something and forgets to return it). Upward Bound is not responsible for missing items. You can also bring snacks (a UB favorite is ramen noodles!). If you don't want to bring snacks, that's okay. You will be provided with healthy and delicious meals every day at UB!

### 8) Can I make phone calls?

Students can use their cell phones during free time in the dorm from 3-5 pm and after evening activities each day. Your parent(s)/guardian(s) will be able to contact you after 3 pm. If your parent(s)/guardian(s) need to call you during the day, they can call the director, Mari Avaloz and she will get in touch with you.

#### 9) Can I drive to the summer program?

Students are **NOT** permitted to drive their personal vehicles to the summer program. Transportation is provided to and from campus. You may leave if a parent or guardian picks you up, and if you have prior approval.

### 10) Why are there two different days for moving in?

Each year we invite new students, Bridge, and SLC members to campus one day earlier than other returning students. We know that the first summer at UB can be a little scary, with over a 100 new faces and names to learn. SLC will plan activities for new students to get to know each other. Bridge students will meet with their Bridge leaders and TA's to review expectations and receive materials for their college course. Returning students (classes of 2024 and 2025) will move in on the morning of June 21st. There will still be the rules, role-plays, and other favorites on the first day that all students are on campus!


# Congratulations Bridge Class of 2023!


