<u>UB Summer 2025 Recap</u>

The St. Olaf TRIO Upward Bound (UB) program returned to the Hill for a successful 2025 Summer Residential Program. This summer was a bit different from previous years, as we revamped the program for the first time. The residential portion was shortened to four weeks for underclass students and five weeks for our 20 first-year college students. For the sixth and final week, 50 UB underclass students went on a fourday trip to Chicago. We hosted a total of 123 UB students on campus this summer, and here are a few highlights from their time with us.

During the four-week program, UB students enrolled in a variety of college-preparatory and elective courses. Offerings included STEM Academy, Thai, Psychology,

Coding, Video Production, and Creative Writing. Students also participated in fun and engaging clubs every Friday morning, such as Self-Care, Comedy, Game & Trivia, Fitness Fridays, Anime, and Cinema.

The rising seniors (Class of 2026) got a head start on their post-secondary plans. Through the Post-Secondary Exploration (PSE) course, they visited six colleges, including Gustavus, St. Olaf, Carleton, and the University of Minnesota Twin Cities. They also began working on their college essays and building their resumes, putting them ahead of the curve as they begin their fall classes.

Twenty students from the UB Class of 2025 participated in our Summer Bridge Program. They took the Science in World and Word course taught by Professor Dan Forstner, and completed a week-long internship on or off campus to explore different career fields. To wrap up their internships, the Bridge students held a poster presentation to share their experiences with the St. Olaf community. We are so proud of all their hard work!

In addition to academics, students enjoyed various evening activities. These included trips to Skateville, bowling at Flaherty's, Grand Slam, and Valleyfair, as well as a bonfire night. Skateville and Valleyfair were big hits. When asked about her favorite activity, current UB student Mu Wah said, "My favorite activities this summer were Skateville and Valleyfair. This summer was the first time I ever got to skate, and it was fun even though I fell. Valleyfair was also fun because we got to go on rides and everything was free!"

The final week of the summer program was capped off with a four-day trip to Chicago for 50 students. The adventure began with a stop for lunch in Wisconsin

Fall Reminders and Announcements

Interim Director Notes: Nou Yang

We are happy to share that Mari, the director of UB, is in her second year of the Bush Fellowship program and is currently out on sabbatical until November. We are continuing all regular programming and services in our schools and look forward to another great academic year with our students, families, and school partners.

UB is pleased to be back in the schools four days a week to offer support and assistance. Please see below when and where you can catch UB staff in action.

Humboldt

UB will be at Humboldt on Mondays from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. We are no longer offering optional after-school tutoring on Mondays, but the UB advisors will be at the school during the day to work and support students in room 3214. Mandatory tutoring is offered on Wednesdays from 3:00 to 5:00 pm in room 3211. Tutoring sessions on Wednesdays are for Humboldt and OWL students. Important note for all Humboldt seniors: You are required to attend UB tutoring for two hours on Wednesday.

Central

UB will be at Central on Mondays from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. We are no longer offering optional after-school tutoring on Mondays, but the UB advisors will be at the school during the day to work and support students in room 1312. Mandatory tutoring will be held in the library on Thursdays from 3:00 to 5:00 pm. Important note for seniors: You are required to attend UB tutoring for two hours on Thursday.

Creative Arts

UB will be at Creative Arts on Tuesdays from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Our office is located on the eighth floor, room 8114. UB will hold mandatory tutoring in the library on Tuesdays from 3:00 to 5:00 pm. Important note for seniors: You are required to attend tutorial sessions for two hours on Tuesday.

Open World Learning (OWL)

UB will be at OWL on Wednesdays from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Our office is located in room 3205. All OWL students are required to attend mandatory tutoring on Wednesdays at Humboldt in room 3211 from 3:00 to 5:00 pm. Important note for all OWL seniors: You are required to attend UB tutoring for two hours on Wednesday.

Highland Park

UB will be at Highland Park on Tuesdays from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and can be found in the CCRC. Mandatory tutoring will be held on Tuesdays from 3:00 to 5:00 pm in the library. Important note for seniors: You are required to attend tutorial sessions for two hours on Tuesday.

Seniors

It is mandatory that you attend UB tutoring for two hours each week. During tutoring, you will dedicate one hour to work on resumes, essays, and college applications! The other hour can be focused on academic school work, or you can continue working on your college materials. Seniors are more than welcome to work with their advisors during the day at Humboldt and Central on Mondays from 9:00 am to 2:30 pm and attend other tutoring days if they are a Post-Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) student; however, they must coordinate with their Bridge advisor.

Phone Calls

Remember, you can call your UB advisor if you have any questions or concerns. You can also call Nou at 507-786-3707.

Advising

Students must meet with their UB advisor each month to complete their advising meeting and review their academic progress! Each student is assigned to one UB Advisor for the year. Each school is assigned a primary Advisor: Nou at Humboldt, Aye Bra at Creative Arts and OWL, Tendor at Highland Park, and Tzolquin will be at Central. Zookong will advise students from both Humboldt and Central.

Mentoring

Similar to last year, mentoring will be a huge focus for our program! UB is excited to continue to set deadlines for letter writing and expects each of you to attend ALL mentoring events this year! Remember, you will not earn your monthly stipend unless you write to your mentor each month! Our first mentor event will be held on Saturday, November 8th, so mark this date in your planners!

Extracurricular Activities

If you are involved in extracurricular activities, we still need to see you ONCE a week! You can check in during advisory, lunch, or a free period (TA hour, etc.). You must ensure that you pick up an extracurricular form for your coach/advisor to sign and complete each month until the end of your extracurricular activity.

All Students

Remember, you are required to attend tutoring for at least one hour on your required tutoring day. Students are also encouraged to attend our virtual study hall sessions via Zoom. This year, we are offering virtual study hall sessions on Mondays from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. Stay tuned for more information regarding our virtual options.

If it goes too far, grades can suffer, which may impact your admission decisions or scholarship opportunities. Colleges review final transcripts, and a drop in grades can put your future plans at risk. In some cases, even your admission to a college could be denied.

Tips for Staying on Track

Prioritize Your Health

- * Get enough sleep and eat well.
- Take breaks to walk, stretch, or engage in other physical activities during the day.
- * Try short mindfulness exercises or spend time outdoors to manage stress.

Set Manageable Goals

- * Break the school year into smaller steps.
- st Set mini-deadlines, such as completing assignments on time, revising essays early, or submitting applications ahead of schedule.
- * Celebrate your progress along the way.

Stay Organized and Proactive

- st Utilize your resources by joining Zoom tutoring sessions, attending in-person tutoring, and connecting with your UB
- * Keep a calendar with test dates, project deadlines, and application due dates.
- * Prepare early so you have time to do your best work without added stress.

Seniors, you have worked hard to get to this point. The finish line is within sight, and this year is your chance to finish strong. Stay focused, take care of yourself, and continue to build on the foundation you've created. Your UB advisors are here to support you every step of the way.
